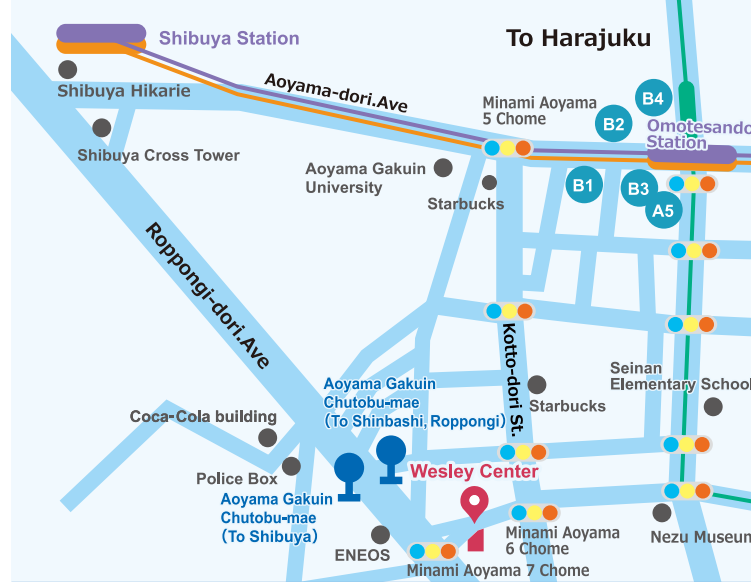

- From Omotesando Station of Tokyo Metro Chiyoda line, Hanzomon line, and Ginza line (10 min walk):**
 Walk straight from Exit B1 and turn left at the "Minami Aoyama 5-chome" traffic light. Walk down Kotto Dori and turn right at the "Minami Aoyama 6-chome" traffic light. Wesley Center will be on your left.
- From Shibuya Station via Aoyamagakuin-Chūtōbu bus stop (3 min walk):**
 From Shibuya Station East Exit Bus Terminal [#51 Bus Stand]
 - T01 bound for Shimbashi station (via Ark Hills)
 - RH01 bound for Roppongi Hills
 Take either of the buses and get off at the first stop "Aoyamagakuin-Chūtōbu". Walk straight towards the same direction of the bus, cross the "Minami Aoyama 7-chome" crosswalk and turn left. Wesley Center will be on your right.

History

- 1874 ● Dora E. Schoonmaker, the first single female missionary in Japan for the Woman's Foreign Missionary Society of the Methodist Episcopal Church, (United Methodist Church) founded a girls' elementary school in Tokyo, Azabu. This Methodist school is the origin of the present Aoayama Gakuin.
- 1965 ● Female missionary house was built in Minami Aoayama 6 Chome area.
- 2010 ● Feb Wesley Center (Building) was built on the site where the female Missionary house was located. Nov. 25th Wesley Foundation was Registered as a General Incorporated Foundation
- 2013 ● Wesley Foundation was registered as a Public Benefit Organization
- 2015 ● Its official name was registered as Wesley Zaidan.
- 2020 ● Wesley Legacy Fund was established.
